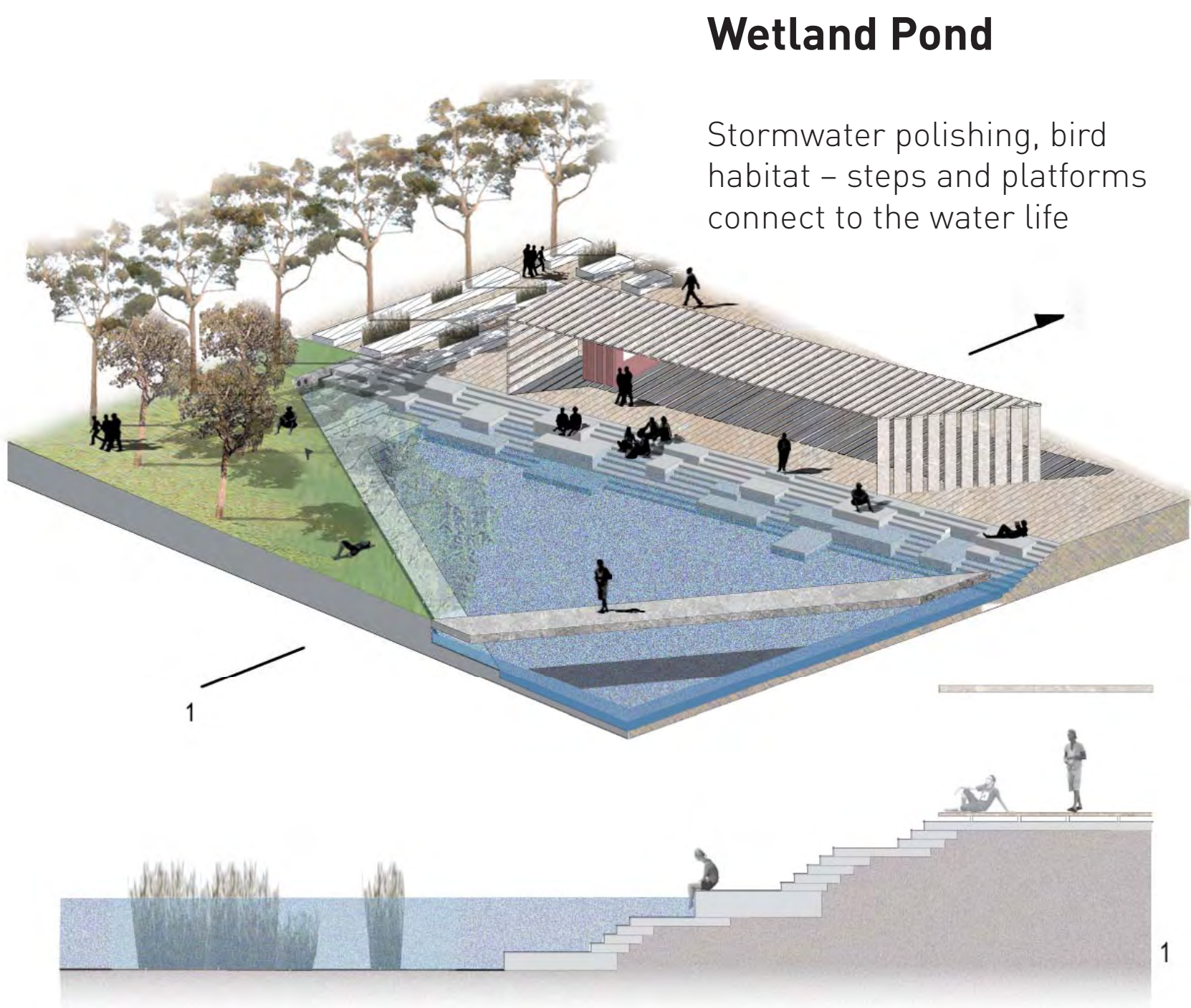




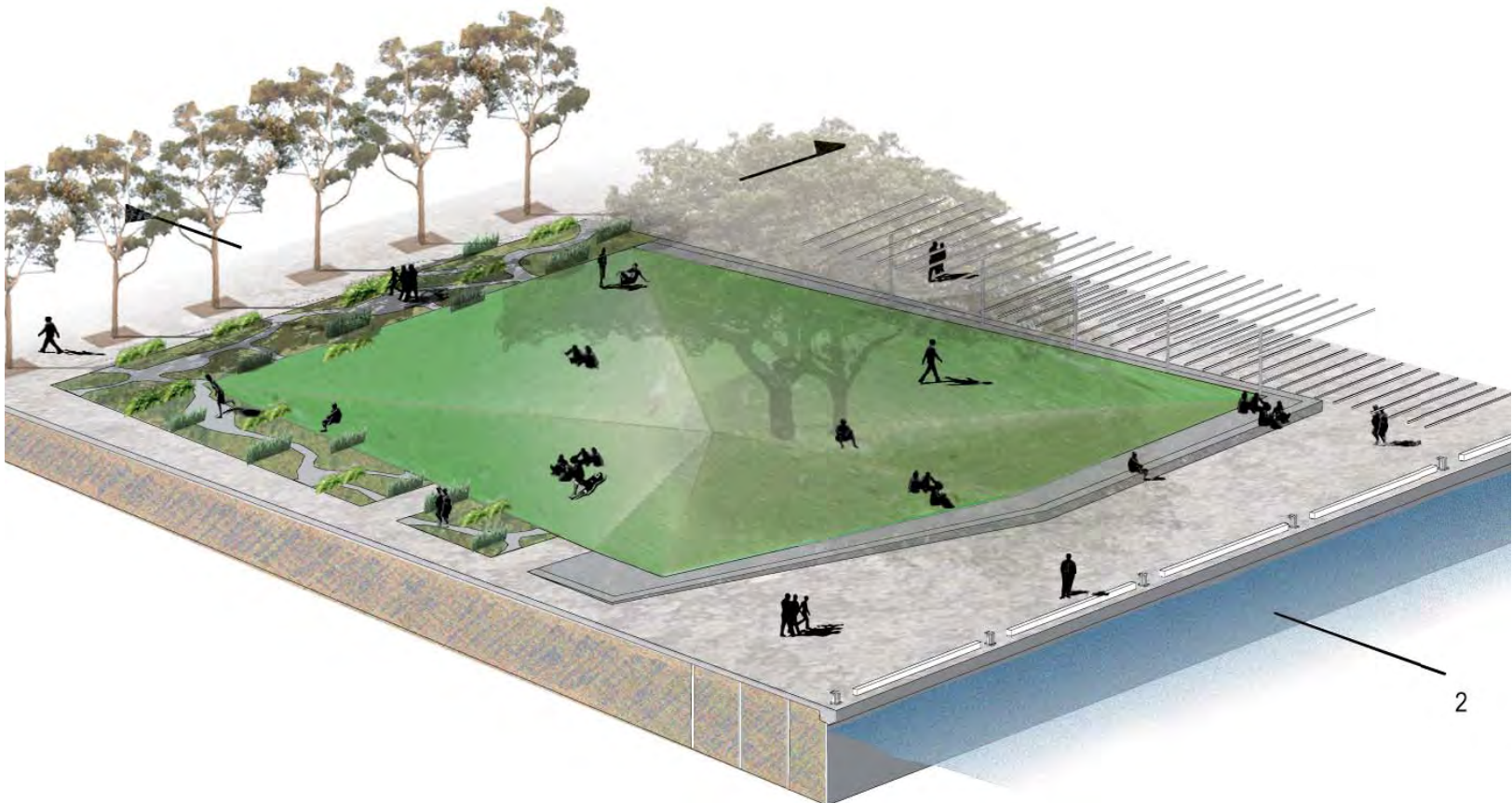
Water Square

Bringing urban life into contact with harbour waters – steps and pontoon lead into and over the water



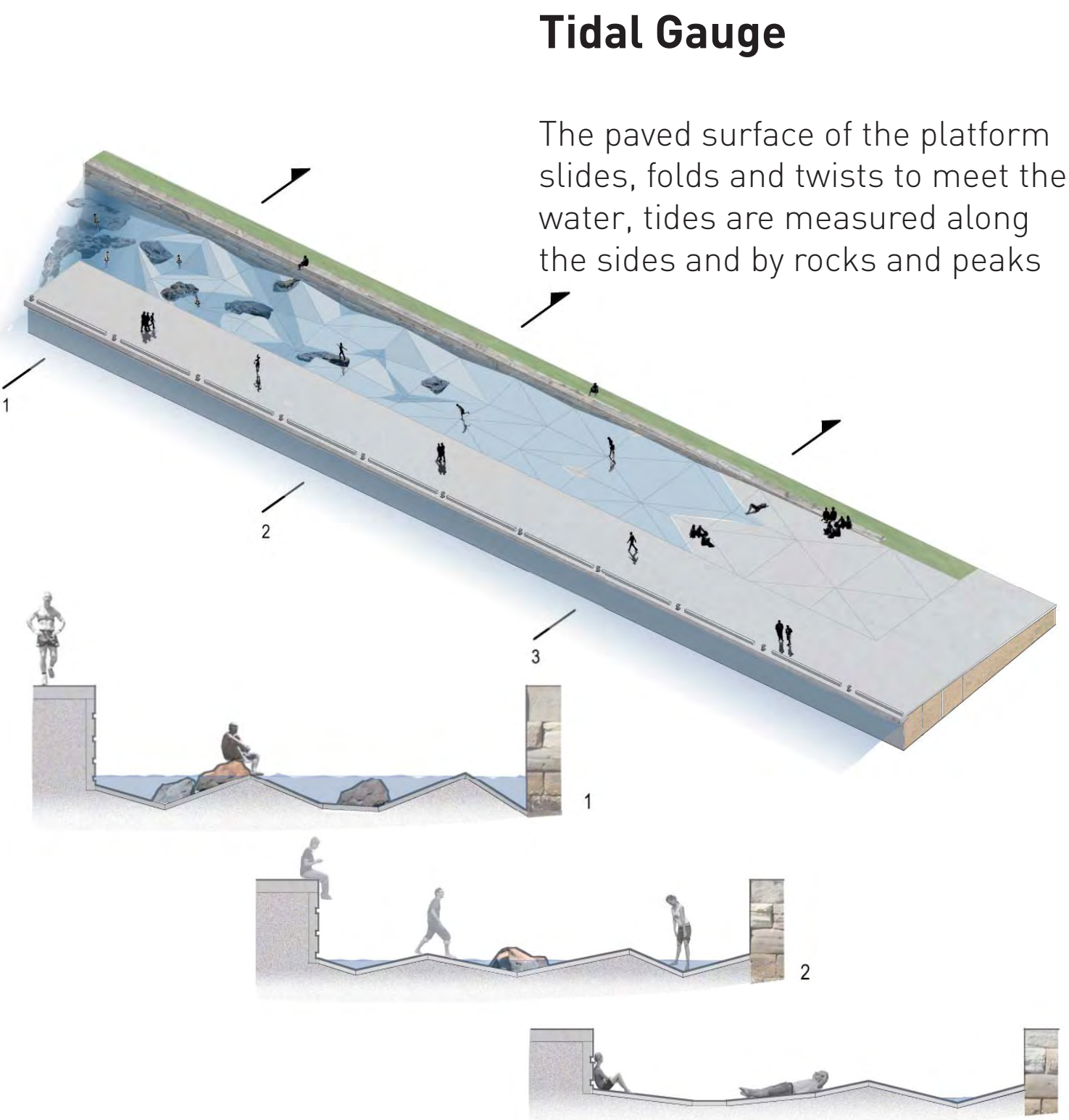
Wetland Pond

Stormwater polishing, bird habitat – steps and platforms connect to the water life



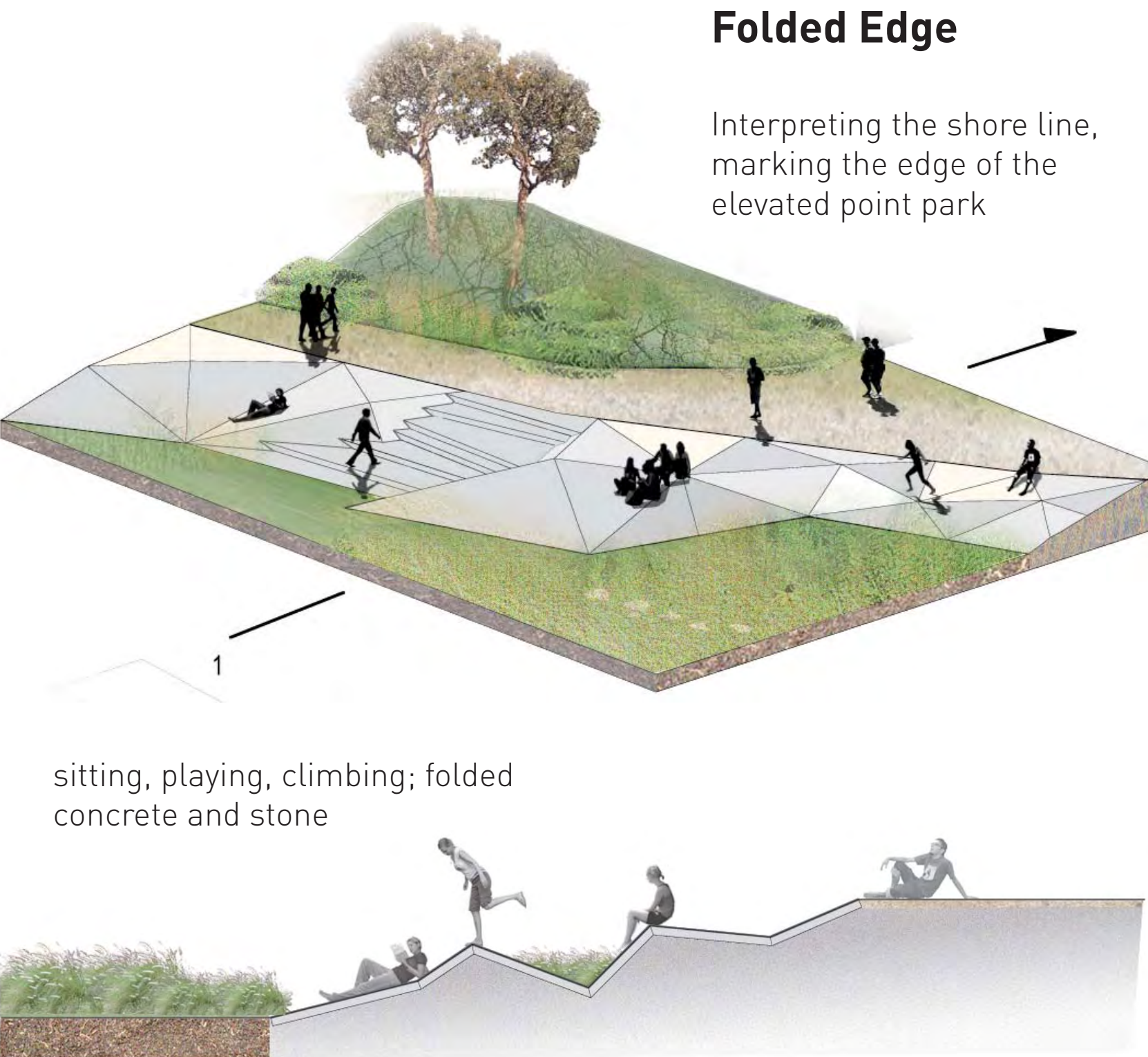
Pod Parks

Tidal Gauge

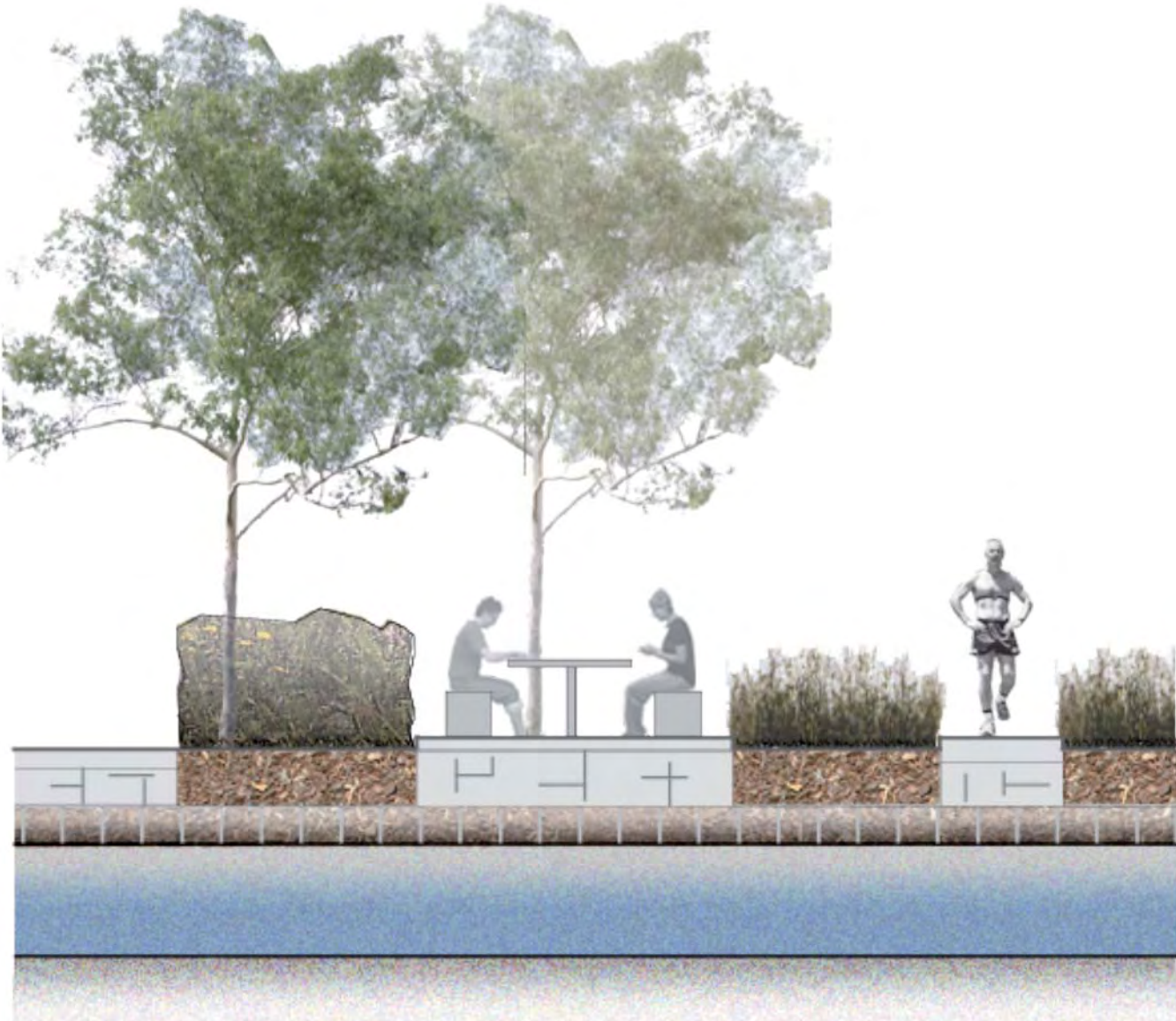
The paved surface of the platform slides, folds and twists to meet the water, tides are measured along the sides and by rocks and peaks



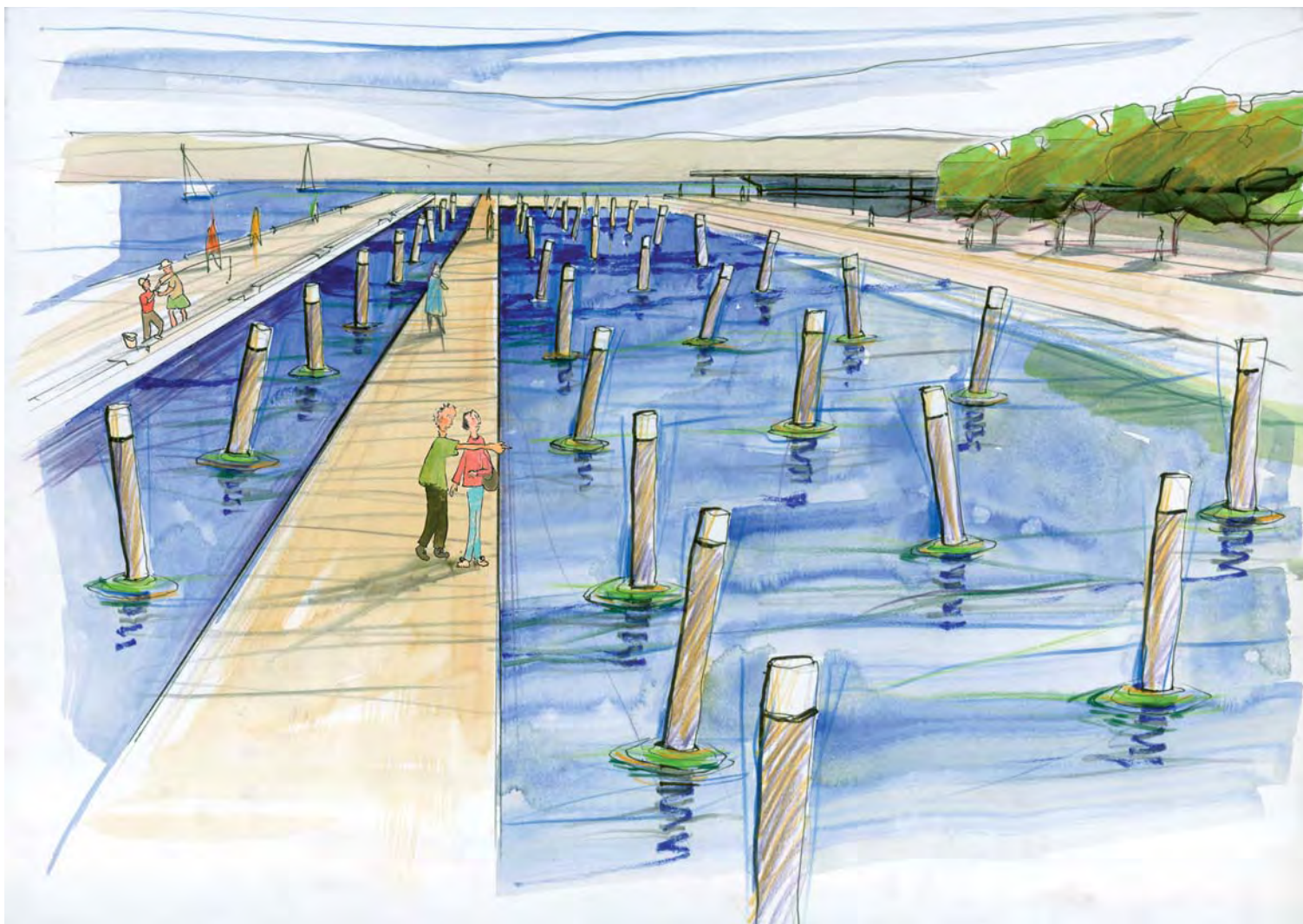
Folded Edge

sitting, playing, climbing; folded concrete and stone

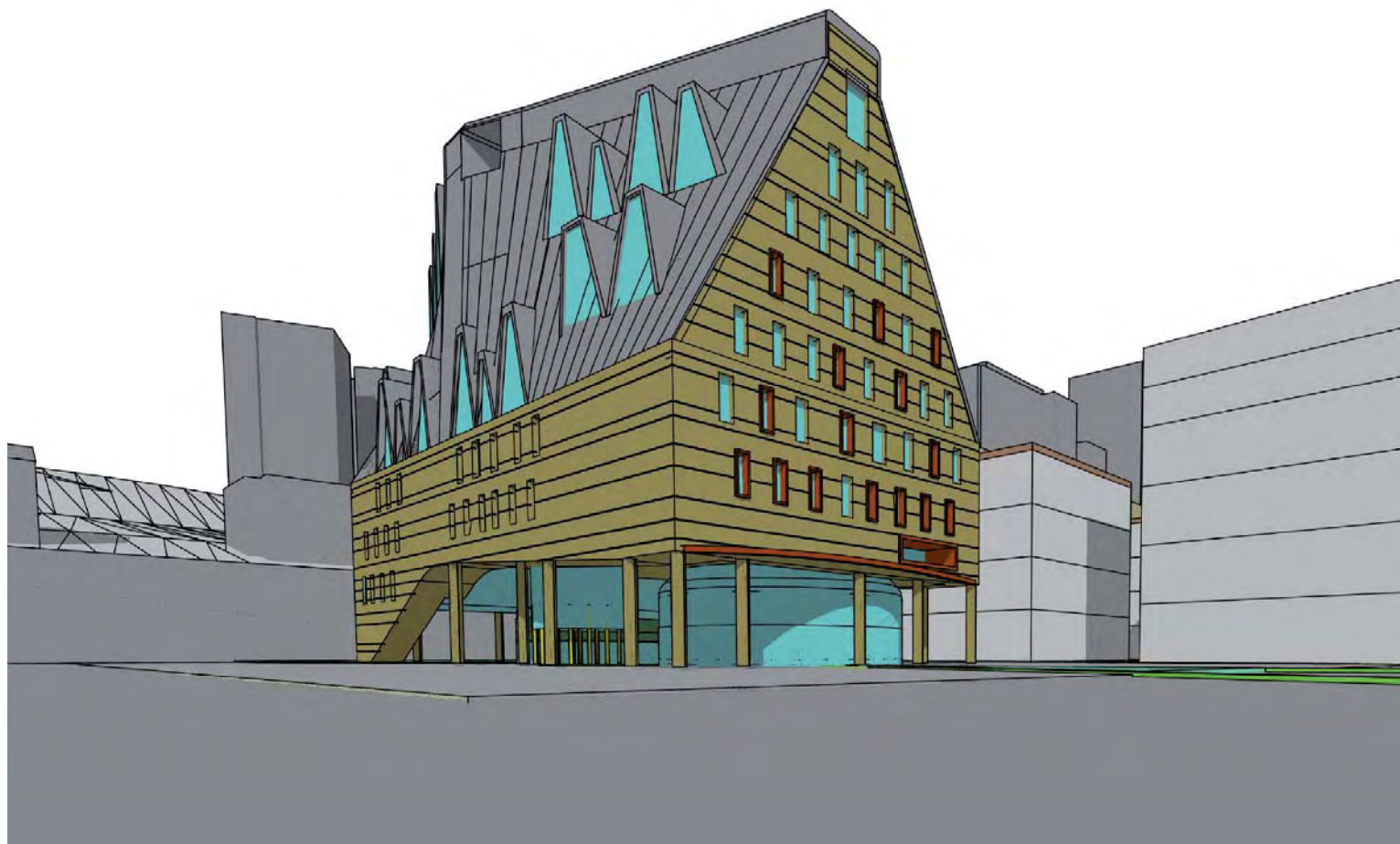


Gardens for withdrawal from activity, filtering stormwater

A forest of hardwood timber piles lose balance in the harbour's tidal waters



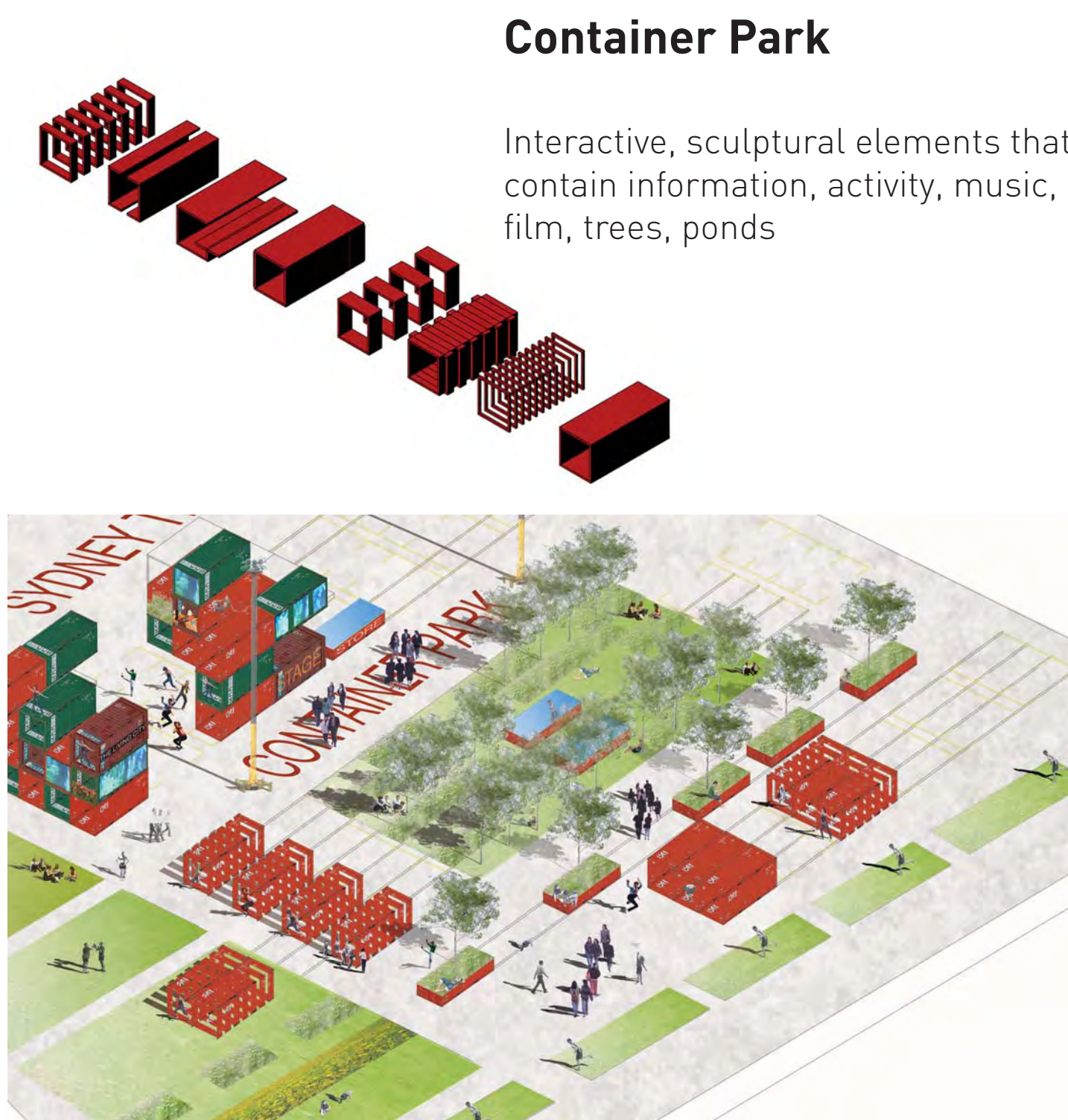
Community Big House
